DEMONSTRATIVE ADJECTIVES

- THIS, THAT, THESE, and THOSE are called demonstrative adjectives.
- They point out or tell about a specific person, place, or thing.

THIS AND THESE POINT OUT SOMETHING THAT IS NEAR.

USE <u>THIS</u> IF THE WORD YOU ARE POINTING OUT IS IN SINGULAR FORM.

- Is this your book?
- the word 'book' is being pointed and it is in singular form.
- This swimming pool is deep.
- the word 'pool' is being pointed and it is in singular form.

USE <u>THESE</u> IF THE WORD YOU ARE POINTING OUT IS IN PLURAL FORM.

- Which of <u>these</u> books is mine?
 - the word 'books' is being pointed and it is in plural form.
- **These** shoes are mine
- the word 'shoes' is being pointed and it is in plural form.
