DEMONSTRATIVE ADJECTIVES

- **THIS, THAT, THESE, and THOSE** are called demonstrative adjectives.
- They point out or tell about a specific person, place, or thing.

THIS AND THESE

POINT OUT SOMETHING THAT IS NEAR.

USE **THIS** IF THE WORD YOU ARE POINTING OUT IS IN SINGULAR FORM.

- Is **this** your book?
 - the word 'book' is being pointed and it is in singular form.
- **This** swimming pool is deep.
 - the word 'pool' is being pointed and it is in singular form.

USE **THESE** IF THE WORD YOU ARE POINTING OUT IS IN PLURAL FORM.

- Which of **these** books is mine?
 - the word 'books' is being pointed and it is in plural form.
- **These** shoes are mine
 - the word 'shoes' is being pointed and it is in plural form.
