Create a cereal box non-fiction book report. You should select an informational book about a topic that is interesting to you. The book should be a book you can read on your own. Include the following information on the front, back, top and sides of your cereal box.

CEREAL BOX REPORT REQUIREMENTS:

FRONT: (10 points)

- Title of Book (2 points)
- Author's Name (2 points)
- Illustration of Topic (5 points)
- Your Name (1 point)

BACK: (10 points)

- 5 fascinating facts about your topic* (5 points)
- Topic choice/reasoning* (5 points)

SIDES: (20 points)

- Vocabulary Words: Select two words from the text that you think would make good vocabulary words. Select words that are difficult or interesting. Then, write the words below, write their definitions and draw a picture to represent each word. (12 points)
- Text Features: Select two nonfiction text features (maps, tables, titles, etc.) that helped you better understand and write under each feature how it helped you with your reading comprehension.* (8 points)

TOP: (5 points)

- Rate the Book (1 point)
- Rating Reason (3 points)
- Pages (1 points)

Returned by or on the Due Date: (5 pts.)
